Tamborine Canungra Full Day Tour

Canungra owes its existence to the timber industry and once boasted one of the largest stands of timber in the colony. David Lahey, the father of Romeo Lahey, owned one of Queensland's largest sawmills at Canungra (Lahey's Canungra Sawmill). By the 1940s most of the timber had



been cut and sawmills were closing. The historic Lahey's Tramway Tunnel is the only remnant of the past sawmilling activities in the area. Following this logging era came beef cattle and dairying.

Tamborine Mountain The area was first settled in the 1800s and has its origins in farming and timber. These rural links remain strong across the Scenic Rim. in the Yugambeh language means wild lime and refers to the finger lime trees that grow on the mountain. The town served the large area along the Canungra Creek and the upper Coomera River. Grapevines were planted at Purga as early as the 1870's, with wine being exported to the UK and Europe where they won numerous gold medals. The industry then went into decline until its resurgence in 1984.

Brisbane is the capital of Queensland and the home of Jonno's Hinterland Tours. Brisbane's recorded history dates from 1799, when Matthew Flinders explored Moreton Bay on an expedition from Port Jackson. The town was conceived initially as a



penal colony for British convicts sent from Sydney. Its suitability for fishing, farming, timbering, and other occupations, however, caused it to be opened to free settlement in 1838. The town became a municipality in 1859 and a consolidated metropolitan area in 1924. Population growth has continued to be among the highest of the Australian capital cities in the first two decades of the 21st century and major infrastructure including the Howard Smith Wharves, Roma Street Parklands, Queens Wharf, the Brisbane River walk, the Clem Jones, Airport Link, and Legacy Way road tunnels, the Airport, Springfield, Redcliffe Peninsula and Cross River Rail lines have been completed or are under construction. Brisbane's metropolitan area has a population of over 2.5 million. From Brisbane we tour Tamborine, Canungra, Maleny, Montville, Mt Cotton and the Brisbane high lights.
